# YEAR IN 2023 REVIEW 2023



The Psychiatrists' Program's® carrier, Fair American Insurance and Reinsurance Company (FAIRCO), is rated "A++ Superior."

A strong defense for our clients is the very foundation of our company. Since our founding in 1986, all claims and lawsuits, whether they are fully defended through trial, mediated, or settled directly, have always been actively managed by PRMS claims staff in full collaboration with our insured psychiatrists. In 2023, we saw **56 claims and lawsuits** filed, compared to 48 in 2022 – since 2020, we've seen a reduction in lawsuits from 87 to 42 in 2023. This brings the total number filed since 1986 to 31,868. In 2023, the severity and average costs of resolution increased, while the filing of administrative actions remained steady at 172.

- » The average indemnity payment was \$337,855 compared to \$284,143 in 2022.
- » There were 172 administrative actions compared to 173 in 2022.
- » In 2023, 66.3% of all claims and lawsuits resolved without indemnity payment compared to 81.3% in 2022.
- » Two cases went to trial, both suicides, and both resulted in defense verdicts.

#### 2023: A LETTER FROM LEADERSHIP

As we welcome a new year, we have a chance to reflect on our achievements from the past year and set new goals for the prospective year. PRMS leadership started 2023 with a vision and strategy for the upcoming year and beyond. Our focus remains on our employees and on enhancing our service to policyholders by improving the online client experience and providing more high-quality touch points within PRMS.

We are proud to be a dedicated partner in the mental health field, which has gained more attention and recognition in recent years in part thanks to celebrities who have spoken about the importance of mental health. In 2023, we continued our commitment to supporting the mental healthcare community through our charitable donations. We recognized various causes such as Pride Month and Suicide Prevention Month and Suicide Prevention Month by donating to different organizations that benefit mental healthcare. I am also happy to announce that our Refer-A-Colleague program reached its tenth anniversary last year. As you may know, we donate \$50 to a mental healthcare organization of your choice for every doctor you refer to us. Your referrals contributed to PRMS writing record new business, adding more than 600 psychiatrists as policyholders. Just as importantly, we donated more than \$12,000 to 50 mental health organizations that serve diverse populations in the mental healthcare community. In the past ten years, we have received 1,800+ referrals, donating more than \$80,000 to 86 organizations.

We know practicing medicine is not easy, and there are many uncertainties and challenges that come with the responsibility to care for others. That is why our risk managers are here to guide and provide you with the information you need to navigate a multitude of topics, from telepsychiatry to information requests to ending the doctor-patient relationship. Our risk management team was quite busy handling more than 3,700 issues in 2023.

Last year we continued to see more in-person events. We co-hosted a reception with the Southern Psychiatric Association in San Francisco, which was one of our most successful events ever! We also hosted our fall reception for the first time since 2019. Our risk management team conducted educational seminars before the APA Annual Meeting and the AACAP meeting, covering telepsychiatry and other relevant topics. We presented 28 PRMS Residents' Education Programs (PREPs) and Grand Rounds and saw a 40% increase in attendance!

We thank you for your trust and confidence and cherish our relationships. Whether you are a client, a partner, or a friend of PRMS, we thank you for being part of our business! We understand psychiatrists have many options for your medical professional liability insurance needs and we are grateful you have chosen us. We invite you to enjoy our 2023 Year in Review!

#### **RISK MANAGEMENT**

Since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, PRMS' Risk Management team has worked tirelessly to continue sharing timely alerts, resources, guidance, and education with clients to help keep their practices and patients safe in the midst of changing laws and regulations.

In addition to answering more than 3,000 calls for 1,528 unique callers on the Risk Management Consultation Service helpline in 2023, our Risk Managers developed new educational content, presented to dozens of organizations and residency training programs, launched two quarterly newsletters for our psychiatric network and residents, and hosted two in-person seminars for clients on Telepsychiatry and Hot Topics, including ketamine and psychedelics, gender-affirming care, and more.

New and updated resources and articles, including A Telepsychiatry Regulatory Compliance Fact Sheet and Requests for Emotional Support Animal Letters, were developed for clients, and we continued to share other resources, like our telepsychiatry resources and new Patient Safety Tips, with the greater mental healthcare community and our partners, in addition to clients.

The Risk Management Consultation Service (RMCS) helpline received 3,009 calls in 2023, bringing the total number of received calls since 1997 to 71,242. Of that number, 213 were first-time callers. More than 3,700 issues were addressed, and nearly 18% of them related to telepsychiatry – resulting in 89,239 issues discussed since 1997.

#### In 2023, Risk Management:

- » Reached more than 2,925 clients and potential clients via in-person (2,535 attendees) and on-demand educational presentations (390 attendees), including:
  - Presented 28 risk management sessions for residency training programs (PREP PRMS' Residents' Education Program) to more than 550 attendees
  - Presented risk management sessions to various organizations, including 21 APA
     District Branch meetings, one AACAP Regional Organization program, and six other organizations' programs, reaching more than 2,400 attendees
- » Provided clients with five educational seminars two in-person and three through our virtual Risk Management Jeopardy: Tournament of Champions – along with CME on-demand courses through our exclusive PRMS U platform, to complete more than 390 total CME courses.
  - 764 clients were first-time PRMS U registrants.
  - PRMS offered clients in-person seminars, "Telepsychiatry" in San Francisco, and "Hot Topics in Psychiatry" in New York City.
  - Entering the realm of CME gamification, PRMS offered clients a new fun and educational way to earn CME utilizing the Jeopardy!® format. The Jeopardy Tournament put players' psychiatric risk management knowledge to the ultimate test in three separate games, with clues addressing a wide variety of risk management and patient safety issues frequently faced by psychiatrists. David Cash, JD, LLM, our Associate Director of Risk Management, hosted each game, adding didactic content throughout.
- » Wrote and published beneficial and timely material including:
  - Four articles in the peer-reviewed journal, Innovations in Clinical Neuroscience, including topics like Treating Patients at Risk for Suicide and Managing Risk While Away from Your Practice
  - Six risk management articles topics included patient safety, telepsychiatry regulatory compliance, emotional support animal letter requests, and patients attending college out-of-state
  - Three risk management alerts including information and resources related to PHE issues, in-person visit requirements for New York, and DEA issues – shared with clients
  - 12 monthly On Our Minds email digests

#### **CLIENT SERVICES & MARKETING**

2023 was a busy year with new developments, including the end of the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency and updates on the use of new treatments in psychiatry practice, such as Ketamine. The PRMS Underwriting team continued to work closely with our Risk Managers to ensure we stay aware of the latest updates and newest trending practices and protocols and make educated decisions on coverage positions. As such, we updated our Ketamine application supplement to include questions on all the most common methods of Ketamine use, enabling Underwriters to properly assess the risk and determine if coverage can be provided.

Additionally, PRMS continued to stay busy creating new and improved features that help make our clients' lives easier. On the financing side, PRMS partnered with Imperial PFS® (IPFS) to launch a new online portal providing a seamless payment experience for clients interested in financing their premiums – eligible clients will now see financing as an option when paying their invoices and can sign up then and there through IPFS. Applying for coverage through PRMS is even easier, too – our new business application has been updated to include telepsychiatry and cybersecurity questions related to your practice, and group clients can now submit renewal applications seamlessly through the Client Online Renewal Application (CORA), saving time and administration for busy practice managers.

The My Program portal continues to be the place where PRMS clients can find important policy documents and helpful resources, easily accessing certificates of insurance documents, PRMS U, telepsychiatry resources, contact information for the Risk Management Consultation Helpline, and invoices. Plus, it's never a bad idea to check My Program to verify your email and contact info and ensure you are enrolled in e-communications to receive the latest alerts, policy communications, and more!

#### **MEET MOONLIGHT!**



#### **REFER A COLLEAGUE**
